

FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD SUNDAY 8[™] JANUARY 2023

Baptism and the New Creation

Today marks the end of the Christmas season. Matthew describes the baptism and anointing by the Holy Spirit of the adult Jesus in a richly symbolic way that expresses Jesus' acceptance of the mission that the Father has given him as God's suffering servant. Jesus' baptism unfolds in the form of a drama in two parts. The first part focuses on Jesus' acceptance of his mission. Jesus comes to John to be baptised, but John objects: "I need to be baptised by you" (Mt 3:14). Although Jesus is the Lamb of God who is without sin, by this action, Jesus, as the Lamb, identifies himself with humanity in order to take away the sins of the world (see Jn 1:29). Jesus' baptism looks forward to his death. When saying that by accepting baptism he "fulfils all righteousness" (Mt 3:15), Jesus submits himself to his Father's will, consenting to a path leading to suffering, death and resurrection for the forgiveness of humanity's sins.

The second part of Matthew's drama focuses on the Father's response to Jesus' acceptance. God identifies Jesus unambiguously as "my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased" (Mt 3:17).

Finally, "the heavens were opened" (Mt 3:16) at Jesus' baptism, reversing what happened through Adam's sin. Adam's rejection of God destroyed the intimate relationship between humankind and God. Now Jesus' baptism restores God's relationship with humankind intended at the beginning of creation.

By accepting baptism, we embrace what Jesus accomplished for us. Through the waters of baptism, we become a new creation, our sins are forgiven and we enter an intimate relationship as a beloved child of God, Father, Son and Spirit, together with all who, like us, have become a new creation through the waters of baptism.

Ukrainian Emergency Winter Appeal

Ukrainians remain resilient despite the circumstances of the war, but they are in the throes of a harsh winter. For that reason a new Emergency Winter Appeal was launched to provide food packages for the most vulnerable on the frontlines and in recently liberated regions in East and South Ukraine which is suffering from a severe humanitarian crisis.

The cost of one food parcel, providing enough food for two people for a week costs approximately £16. Each package contains the basics (grains, flour, pasta, meat and fish preserves, oil, canned vegetables, sugar, tea coffee, biscuits, etc.)

It is hoped that £160,00 can be raised allow the supply of 10,000 food parcels to those most in need and I ask that you and your parishioners will consider supporting this Emergency Winter Appeal.
