

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SUNDAY 16th JULY 2023 (A)

Being Receptive and Fruitful to the Word of God

Today's readings use farming images to teach about God's powerful word and about our receptiveness to that Word.

The first reading is part of an oracle, a prophetic message of consolation intended for the people of Judah as they suffered in the Babylonian exile. God's Word is gentle like the rain, the prophet says and as effective as the watered earth, which gives life to the seeds and produces food for the hungry.

In the second reading, Paul ruses creation and birthing imagery to talk about the glory that awaits us in the life to come. His argument is difficult to follow, in part because of some grammatical problems with the text, but also because he is referring to the Adam and Eve story from Genesis. Paul is saying that God's cursing of the ground as a result of Adam's sin (see Gn. 3:17) is a reason for hope, not despair. Creation as we know it is like a woman in labour who is about to give birth and the baptised are the first fruits of the harvest offered to God as a pledge that all of creation will one day be redeemed.

The Gospel reminds us that the fruitfulness of the earth and our own lives should not be taken for granted. Matthew describes Jesus as teaching a parable about planting seeds. A parable is a true-to-life symbolic story that surprises its hearers with its message. Everyone in Jesus' time would have known about the challenges of farming. But the surprising thing is that the good soil – those who hear God's Word and act on it – produces a harvest so abundant that it would have been impossible in the ancient world and still today.

"CAFOD Fix the Food System campaign

Salina, a small-scale organic farmer from Bangladesh who saves her own seeds, has written a letter to the President of the World Bank asking him to:

- Protect the fundamental rights of small farmers to save, use, exchange and sell their own varieties of seeds.
- Put an end to all policies that limit small farmers' choice over which seeds they can access.

This week and next weekend, CAFOD will be inviting you to co-sign Salina's letter to help her voice to be heard in the highest places. Please support us. Bishop Paul Swarbrick has already signed. Note: 3 years ago, just 30,000 ordinary parishioners supporting a CAFOD campaign on renewable energy led to the International Monetary Fund ending its support for fossil fuels overseas. Campaigning really does work."

Did you know that:

- Just 9 crops now make up over 65% of all traded crop production
- Just three huge corporations control over 60% of the seed supply.
- These corporations have been applying huge pressure on the World Bank to require poor countries receiving loans to have mandatory seed certification.
- This makes it illegal for a farmer to save their own seed. They can only buy commercial seeds.
- Such seeds require significant amounts of pesticides and fertilisers which the farmers can ill-afford and which devastate the local flora and fauna.
- They are also often bred so that the seeds they produce are sterile, so the farmers have no option but to buy new seed the following year, driving them into dependency and often debt.

Are you outraged? In a fortnight's time we will be inviting you to sign an open letter to the World Bank calling for the protection of the right of farmers to save and use their own varities of seeds. Please support us.
