

TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SUNDAY 25TH JUNE 2023 (A)

Hope in the face of Evil

On this Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we learn to find hope in the face of evil – through God's grace.

To fully appreciate the passage from Jeremiah, we need to know the backstory. The prophet has been complaining against God for tricking him into becoming a prophet and bringing disgrace upon him. He tries to keep his mouth shut, he says, but he cannot contain God's Word (Jer 20:7-9). God's words of condemnation and warning incite the people's anger. This is why Jeremiah sounds so paranoid in the opening lines of today's first reading. But notice how quickly his despair turns to hope. Although the imagery is violent for today's readers, Jeremiah sees God as the mighty warrior who stands at his side to vindicate him before his enemies. What better reason to praise God!

Today's Gospel is the last part of Jesus' instruction to the twelve apostles before he sends them on mission. He has just told them that because of their message they will be beaten and dragged before civil authorities, but they need not fear because the Holy Spirit will give them words to speak (see Mt 10:16-20). Although their situation may be dire, they should be full of hope, because God knows even the number of hairs on their heads.

And what is the reason for our hope? In today's second reading, Paul calls Adam a type of Jesus Christ. A type is a pattern or blueprint of the more perfect thing that is to come. But this type is more like a photo negative, yielding a more perfect opposite. Paul says Adam brought sin into the world and everyone suffered its effects, but Christ brought grace into the world and it overflowed for everyone. He is the reason for our hope.
