

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY 4TH JUNE 2023

The Household of God

The first reading, from Exodus, comes just after the sad story about the Israelites making a golden calf and offering sacrifices to it (Ex 32). Although God pronounces judgment against the people, he comes down to meet Moses on the mountain; God reveals his true nature by reinstating the covenant with Israel. Why? Because God is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, faithful, and kind.

The second reading is the closing greeting of Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians. In it, he suggests that God extends grace through the Father, love through the Son and fellowship through the Spirit, so that humanity can live in love and fellowship with one another. Later theologians would see this as an example of the activities of the "economic Trinity". The term comes from the Greek word *Oikonomikos*, which means "pertaining to the management of a household", in this case, the household of God.

Likewise, the Gospel highlights God's activity in salvation history. God the Father is described as giving the greatest gift of love to the world – his only Son – and the Son is described as doing the work of the Father. The Spirit is not mentioned here, but later in John's Gospel account we learn that the Spirit is the Advocate sent to be with the believers after Jesus' return to the Father.
