

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT SUNDAY 5TH MARCH 2023

Peak Experiences

Readings: Gen 12:1-4a; Tim 1:8b-10; Matt 17:1-9

Scripture:

[A] bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice . . . (Matt 17:5)

Reflection: This Sunday's Gospel acclamation ("From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard") is among my favourites as a cantor. Having seen many shining clouds as a hiker in Idaho's mountains, I can testify to the inspirational power of skies brightened even by natural causes. Last year I stood silent and awed with friends on the eve of this "Transfiguration Sunday" on a summit gleaming with snow, valleys spread below, racing clouds billowing dark then backlit bright, as the sun edged toward setting. We weren't transfigured (except perhaps with the grace to descend safely on our cross-country skis), but the reverent wonder of that moment inflected the evening's conversation and the words I proclaimed at Mass hours later and it still lingers in my soul.

The notion that mountaintops are conducive to spiritual insight is ancient and widespread. Lofty, wild places, it's been speculated, naturally affect our minds and emotions. Their wide views help us feel closer to heaven, their isolation banishes worldly distractions, their perspective dissolves self-absorption. "He who is not illuminated by such the great splendour of created things is blind, "St. Bonaventure wrote. "Open your eyes, therefore... that you may see, hear, praise and worship, glorify and honour your God."

As a people who acknowledge the synthesis between earth and heaven embodied in today's Scripture, let us raise our eyes to the heavens on this Sunday of transfiguration and just as Bonaventure urges, let their wonder infuse our celebration with a special luminous light.

Meditation: These days the most famous naturally beautiful spots tend to be overrun with jostling crowds. Vow that at least once this Lent, you'll visit (even if virtually) a quiet, natural area with a long view (a hilltop, a broad meadow, a seashore) and spend time in silence. Allow the experience to touch, quiet and fill your heart with awe and gratitude.

Prayer: I lift my soul to you today, transfigured Lord, in grateful praise for the earth's inspirational beauty, the sky's uplifting glory.
