

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER SUNDAY 1^{SI} MAY 2022

"Come and have breakfast......Do you love me? Feed my Sheep" The source & summit of our faith is the Eucharist

On this Third Sunday of Easter Time, we hear of the disciples' unyielding determination to embrace their call to bear witness to Jesus, crucified but raised up by God. The earliest disciples who experienced the risen Christ and the beginnings of their own transformation continue to spread this message despite the cost. Facing opposition from fellow Jews, they stand firm: "We must obey God rather than men" (Acts 5:29). To follow and bear witness to Jesus means to be like the one whom God brought through death to fullness of life.

The second reading also presents the full paschal mystery: the "Lamb that was slain" now shares "honour and glory and blessing" with God (Rv 5:12). Revelation is apocalyptic literature, which always looks forward to the final completion of God's work of salvation. While its intricate symbolism can be difficult to interpret, Revelation fundamentally offers hope for the future – hope rooted in God's saving action in past and present.

John's resurrection account hints that the call to bear witness to the death and resurrection of Jesus applies to all disciples, for it is a message for all people. Today's reading comes from the last chapter of John, probably an editor's epilogue, but still part of the Good News.

Like Revelation, this Gospel account is laden with symbolism. Here it presents the risen Christ's encounter with seven disciples. Seven, a biblical symbol for perfection or completion, suggests the entire community of disciples. As in the first reading, listening to Jesus bears abundant fruit. The disciples cast their net as he instructs, and the catch exceeds all expectation. This great number of fish (153) also carries a deeper meaning. Since Greek zoologists listed a total of 153 species of fish, the tremendous catch implies that the Good News must be carried to all humankind.
