


# English Martyrs Catholic Darish <u>TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME</u> <u>SUNDAY 18<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER 2022</u> <u>HOME MISSION DAY</u>

Today's reading introduces us to one of Scripture's most vocal prophets on social justice. Amos, a contemporary of Hosea, preached shortly before the fall of the Northern Kingdom (c.721 BC). Both prophets pointed to Israel breaking the covenant as the reason for the impending destruction from Assyria. But whereas Hosea focused on idolatry as the main issue, Amos set his rhetorical crosshairs on the social injustice that ran rampant in that territory.

Amos was known for his harsh tone and earthy imagery as well as his preaching. He purposefully turned inside-out the slogans of self-righteous wealthy Israelites. They claimed to await the "Day of the Lord" (see Am 5:18) when God will judge the world, but Amos assured them their treatment of the poor would be their ruin on that day. They claimed a special immunity because God brought them from Egypt, but Amos retorted that this privilege only made them all the more culpable after they wasted God's special treatment.

The covenant explicitly prohibited mistreatment of the poor, widows and orphans. These people had little chance of legal recourse and were easily cheated out of their homes and livelihoods if some wealthy person bribed a judge. Amos' sarcastic mockery of the wealthy (one of his favourite strategies) portrays them as gleefully anticipating the next opportunity to use their status to increase the suffering of the poor by denying them basic necessities like food and shelter.

The Gospel develops their message regarding wealth and spirituality. One cannot be devoted both to wealth and to God in the same manner. In order to serve God, one must recognise the significant demands he makes for us regarding how we treat one another.
