

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER SUNDAY 22ND MAY 2022


In the light of today's tensions and conflicts, it is tempting to think that early Christian life was far more peaceful. In fact, Jesus' disciples faced differences and conflict from the beginning.

Today's reading from Acts immediately follows that of last Sunday, which described Paul and his co-workers rejoicing that God had "opened the door of faith to the Gentiles" (Acts 14:27). But some Judean Christians insisted that Gentile Christians must follow all Jewish religious practices, including circumcision. Debates ensued between Paul and the disciples in Jerusalem, resulting in the decision we find here that required Gentiles to follow only some Jewish practices.

The most important aspect of this ruling is its source: "the Holy Spirit and ...us" (Acts 15:28). Apparently, the early Christian community deeply believed that Christ, crucified and raised, continued to guide them in the presence of the Spirit.

Continuing its apocalyptic vision, the second reading expresses this conviction in another way. Old Testament Judaism believed that God dwelled in the Jerusalem Temple. But in the new age of salvation, God's presence is available everywhere and always in the risen Christ, our new Temple.

In the Gospel, Jesus identifies love with obedience, something we are empowered to do by the Spirit sent by the Father in Jesus' name. God's Spirit is our "Advocate", parakletos in Greek, meaning "one called to the side of" another. At the Last Supper, Jesus promised the disciples that although he would soon leave them, he would ask the Father to send "another Advocate to be with [them] always" (Jn 14:16). The Spirit as Paraclete remains with disciples in every age, continuing Jesus' teaching (see Jn 14:26)
