

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SUNDAY 23RD OCTOBER 2022

Luke often contrasts Pharisees and tax collectors. The two groups act as ironic foils within Luke's view of God's plan for salvation. The initial chapters of Luke's account explain that Jesus' ministry changes the world fundamentally: the poor will be blessed while the rich suffer loss; mighty Rome will fall and the lowly, occupied people of Israel will rise. But this inversion is not only political and social but also theological. Those thought to stand at the pinnacle of righteousness are exposed as disobedient, while impure, lowly outsiders are invited to God's Kingdom. So it is with this Pharisee and tax collector.

Pharisees were often considered to have the ideal relationship with God. They studied, taught the law of Moses and regularly fasted, They followed a conservative code for ritual wishing in order to maintain a constant state of religious purity and they believed this separated them from the less observant. But according to today's Gospel, they compared themselves to those they thought were below them.

Tax collectors stood at the opposite end of the purity spectrum. Their connections with Rose made them unclean outsiders, and their routine encounters with Gentile property and money put them in a constant state of ritual impurity. They were pariahs to the occupied locals. According to custom, the impure had to wash to a particular level of purity before entering the Temple in Jerusalem. A tax collector might need to wash for hours or days before entering its gates.

We are meant to feel the distance between Pharisee and tax collector as almost physical. Yet the tax collector spoke to God as best he could. In Jesus' view, that man went home in right relationship with God. He could recognize his flaws before God and ask for forgiveness, something the Pharisee could not do.
