

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SUNDAY 26TH JUNE 2022

Today's first reading and Gospel show us different reactions to the call to discipleship. When the great prophet, Elijah, designates Elisha to be his successor, the young man asks to see his parents for a farewell and Elijah is disgusted by his hesitation. Immediately, Elisha severs his ties and follows Elijah. In the Gospel, Jesus invites people to follow him, but they hesitate for one reason or another. Jesus' and Elijah's responses, when taken literally, seem harsh, but they convey a central tenet of discipleship: it must be wholehearted. No one who is still attached to the world "is fit for the Kingdom of God" (Lk 9:62).

Sandwiched between the two call and commitment stories is Paul's teaching about the greater importance of faith over the law. This perspective encountered consistent criticism from his opponents: How would people live in a holy manner without the guidance of the law? After all, if a person could be saved by faith, then what did their actions matter? Paul replies that his message does imply a code of ethics to which believers must adhere, but this code is from the Spirit, who is received at baptism. Baptized Gentile believers should be able to live moral lives because they are guided by God's Spirit, yet they remain free from any confinement of Jewish customs or the law.

But Paul warns that this new-found freedom in the Spirit must not be misused by believers. Once chained under the slavery of sin and death, believers die with Christ to nullify their bonds of slavery. But this new freedom should be used to remain free in the Spirit and not allow one to become enslaved to one's own desires of the flesh. With great freedom comes great responsibility. The Spirit guides new believers to live in a manner appropriate for God's people. This is God's will: their freedom and their continued sanctification.
