

# THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SUNDAY 6<sup>™</sup>NOVEMBER 2022

Today's first reading, though gruesome, details a pivotal point in the development of Jewish and Christian theology. The story of the mother and sons executed for practicing Jewish customs occurs in the second century BC during the reign of a Greek king, Antiochus Epiphanes IV. When the Greeks invaded Palestine in 333 BC, they had allowed the Jews to retain their customs. But after Antiochus tried to use the treasures of the Temple in Jerusalem to pay his debts and riots erupted, he reversed this. Blaming loyalty to traditions for the uprising, Antiochus executed Jews who refused to break the law of Moses, the core of Jewish life.

This era marked a significant change in Jewish theology. It had often been presumed that those who kept the law were rewarded immediately with good things in this life, while those who did evil were punished with an early, difficult death (see Dt28-29). But after the brutal experience of exile stirred a critique of such easy answers to the question of suffering (see the Book of Job), an alternative view emerged. Now those who died early could be faithful to the law while the guilty might live but awaited punishment. And so persecuted, observant Jews expected future vindication and punishment of evil.

The story in 2 Maccabees represents a type of literature that was popular at this time and remained so in the Christian era. The defiant statements of the brothers and their mother reflect the hope in the resurrection that became central for the Judaism of Jesus' time and for the faith of the New Testament. Such apocalyptic literature was inherently countercultural. Its readers looked beyond the present to the reality that awaits in the future world. Thus it supported resistance to the values and powers of the present world.
