

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME SUNDAY 8TH AUGUST 2021

I am the Bread of Life

The Letter to the Ephesians seems to provide a marked contrast to the other two readings today. Paul continues his exhortation to live as new people, marked by the seal of the Holy Spirit (probably a reference to Baptism). Particularly actions and attitudes, such as bitterness, anger, and slander, are unworthy of such people. On the other hand, kindness and forgiveness are to be encouraged, even expected. For the Ephesians, the best and only example of love and forgiveness was Jesus.

Two phrases from the other two readings might give clues as to how the Ephesians and the other members of the early Church were supposed to persevere in their spiritual transformation. In the First Reading, the Lord provides Ezekiel with food and drink in the wilderness. The first time, God simply commands Ezekiel to eat. The second time, God adds the single phrase, "else the journey will be too long for you". While the reference to Ezekiel's trip to Horeb is clear, the idea of a journey can apply also to the process of renewal – spiritual journey – apparent in Ephesians. The lesson seems clear. Eat the food that God provides and you will have strength for the journey.

John's account again identifies Jesus as the "living bread that came down from heaven". John adds, "Whoever eats this bread will live forever". Belief in Jesus yields eternal life. Belief is the fundamental, life-changing event. If the command of God in Ezekiel is to eat, the command of Jesus in John is to eat this bread from heaven and live forever. In Baptism, the Ephesians inherit both messages. Jesus is the food they must eat for the journey. In their love and forgiveness, they reflect the eternal life Jesus gave them through his own death on the cross. The Gospel according to John and the Letter to the Ephesians form interwoven pictures of a faith that leads to life and the discipleship that springs from that faith. Belief in Jesus Christ, as Paul is fond of saying, means the Christian is no longer a slave to sin but free to choose a different kind of life – one of kindness and love.

In what sense is faith in Jesus a gift of God? In what way do we have to work at it?
