<u>SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER/SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY (A)</u> <u>SUNDAY 16[™] APRIL 2023</u>

The resurrection's transforming power is apparent in today's readings. In the Gospel, the frightened disciples are changed as Jesus enters the room in which they are hiding. With the greeting Shalom, Jesus offers them blessings on every dimension of their being. This blessing, translated as "Peace be with you" (Jn 20:21), communicates God's mercy. Jesus goes further by extending the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples, saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them" (19:22-23). The Spirit's power transforms their lives, enabling them to extend God's mercy and forgiveness to those who seek it.

The risen Lord still bears the marks of his crucifixion. He is always the wounded Christ, as the Book of Revelation relates (5:6). The apostle Thomas is not present on this occasion and refuses to believe the witness of the other disciples. A week later Thomas is present when the risen Lord appears again. There, Thomas makes a confession of faith as he says, "My Lord and my God!" (Jn 20:28). Jesus responds by blessing those who have not seen and yet believed.

The reading from the Acts of the Apostles offers an insight into the life of that first Christian community transformed by the risen Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit. United in Spirit, they shared their possessions and no one was in need. They present the ideal Christian community open to God's grace.

Peter, in the second reading, uses the form of a Jewish blessing to praise God. These words remind people today of the risen Christ's new life received in baptism. "Although you have not seen him you love him" (1 Pt 1:8) are the most reassuring words addressed to us today.

Pope Francis Preaches on Divine Mercy

"Brothers and sisters, let us think of all those times when we received the pardon and peace of Jesus. Each one of us has received them; each one of us has had that experience. It is good for us to remember those moments. Let us put the memory of God's warm embrace before the memory of our own mistakes and failings. In this way, we will grow in joy."

"There are times of difficulty when life seems to belie faith, moments of crisis when we need to touch and see. Like Thomas, it is precisely in those moments that we rediscover the heart of Christ, the Lord's mercy."

"In those situations, Jesus does not approach us in triumph and with overwhelming proofs. He does not perform earth-shattering miracles, but instead offers us heart-warming signs of his mercy. He comforts us in the same way he did in today's Gospel: He offers us his wounds. We must not forget this fact. In response to our sin, the Lord is always present, offering us his wounds."

God's mercy often makes us more aware of our neighbours' wounds, encouraging everyone to seek to help those suffering in mind or body, to bring peace to those suffering spiritually or physically, and to listen and bring comfort to another person. For, in doing such things, we "encounter Jesus."

"We think that we are experiencing unbearable pain and situations of suffering, and we suddenly discover that others around us are silently enduring even worse things. If we care for the wounds of our neighbour and pour upon them the balm of mercy, we find being reborn within us a hope that comforts us in our weariness."
